



Barcelona is a clear example of social and environmental commitment and how cities face global challenges. Together with other metropolitan areas around the world, we are working as a network to address environmental emergencies, overcoming our limitations as a local administration.

The Covid-19 pandemic has reinforced the importance of sustainable urban design policies. Barcelona is committed to reducing emissions and promoting new urban growth, with sustainability as an inevitable principle, and to building partnerships with other players. An example of this is the Consorci de la Zona Franca de Barcelona (CZFB): In 2021 the Zona Franca has consolidated its position as the Barcelona metropolitan area's premier platform for generating new opportunities, a key area where the city can plan, analyse and experiment with new models of production, mobility and economy 4.0 on a real scale and in real time.

The Zona Franca has exhibited courage in developing new production models such as the 3DIncubator high-tech centre, the DFactory 4.0 technology hub and facilitating the expansion of Mercabarna. It has also faced the environmental and energy challenge by participating in the Strategic Project for the Recovery and Economic Transformation (Proyecto Estratégico para la Recuperación y Transformación Económica or PERTE) of electric and connected vehicles, promoting photovoltaic panels on the roofs of industrial buildings, extended the bicycle lane network or contributing, together with TMB, to the construction of the first green hydrogen filling station for transport in our country.

There is no doubt that few cities in the world have such outstanding public spaces as the Zona Franca de Barcelona, which serves as an urban laboratory for new productive uses and, by extension, for new emerging professions.

As the Mayor of Barcelona and President of the Board of the Consorci de la Zona Franca de Barcelona, it is a pleasure to see the brilliant culmination of the DFactory as an industrial 4.0 hub and a magnet for talent and new job growth, the consolidation of the Barcelona New Economy Week (BNEW) and the commitment to gender equality of the Barcelona Woman Acceleration Week (BWAW). These initiatives and many others demonstrate the important role played by the Consorci de la Zona Franca in implementing a climate and productive agenda from a truly social perspective.

After launching the Women's Council (Consell de la Dona) with the participation of around fifteen companies from the industrial sector, this year CZFB has launched the first edition of the Barcelona Woman Acceleration Week (BWAW). With the overarching goal of contributing to the advancement of equality, we are convinced that we must take advantage of the talent of the women who make up half of our

society. BWAW follows in the wake of another great event initiative, the Barcelona New Economy Week (BNEW) launched by CZFB, with a successful expanded edition in 2021 that again positioned Barcelona as the global capital of the new economy.

Overall, it was a very positive year. We continue to move forward as a transformational engine, committed to digitisation and innovation and confident that together we can build a more just society.





We are members of **Barcelona's 2030 Agenda Committee**, a citizen participation body created by the City Council to examine aspects related to the city's sustainability.





The hub is a tool for transforming the Spanish productive fabric, making it more competitive, and assisting companies in their digitisation processes, as a key driver for ecological transition.

Three types of players are present at its facilities:

Fundación Leitat was a technological partner of the project in 2021. It is currently moving human and technical resources from additive printing companies such as HP to the facilities.

The building is equipped with mixed research units, laboratories with the latest 4.0 technology, incubation space, common areas and dining facilities.




3D Incubator, a success story







We joined forces with the Fundación Bertelsmann in the Alliance for Dual Vocational Training to develop quality education (SDG 4) and decent work and economic growth (SDG 8).

Study on Dual Vocational Training in the **Llobregat Delta** region and survey of ZF companies

We commissioned an analysis, diagnosis and action plan to promote Dual Vocational Training in the Llobregat Delta region, as well as the supply and demand for this type of **training offer** in the ZF environment. This opened up a new collaboration opportunity for key entities in the Delta public space.



Metropolis FPLab **Scholarship**

A metropolitan programme that provides funding through grants for vocational training as a means of fostering the presence of women in industry.



Report on **"New Trends and Training Needs in the 3D sector"**

We are working with the Fundació BCN Formació Professional to determine the profiles needed by the 3D industry and the related training requirements to be developed.

Zona Franca Industrial Estate Accessibility study

We worked with COCEMFE (Spanish Confederation of People with Physical and Organic Disabilities) to prepare an initial study of accessibility to this production area which occupies 6% of the Barcelona municipal district. This is a key report which will serve as a blueprint for developing **future maintenance and urban planning actions**.

The **industrial environment** is particularly sensitive to behaviours linked to the consumption of energy, water, natural resources, circular energy dynamics and respect for the environment.

It is therefore essential for us to promote energy generated from **renewable sources and environmentally responsible attitudes.**

Energy and transport, spearheading sustainability

Promoting the use of **photovoltaic energy** and energy cooperation

We have set up working groups with **approximately 30 companies** on the industrial estate to promote renewable energy and the installation of photovoltaic panels, thereby opening up prospects for the creation of energy communities in the industrial area.

Agreement with the Barcelona City Council for **industrial roofs**

We signed an agreement with the Barcelona City Council to **encourage the installation of photovoltaic panels** for both individual and community use. We promote photovoltaic power generation under the new agreements, acting as a facilitator for this type of energy in collaboration with the municipality, which will also encourage its use.


Decarbonisation Agreement with **AMB**

In May 2021 we joined the metropolitan agreement for the development of renewable hydrogen technologies and for a **decarbonised Catalonia**, confirming our commitment to the promotion of green mobility and the fight against climate change. Through this agreement we support:

- **Hydrogen energy initiatives** for public transport
- Creation of a **green hydrogen research centre**
- **Promotion** of vocational training and **start-ups** in this sector
- Support for the **Green Hydrogen Valley Platform** of Catalonia sponsored by URV (Rovira i Virgili University)
- Willingness to **collaborate with renewable hydrogen initiatives** from other areas of Spain

Industry and Energy Transition **Workshop**

Virtual workshop with the participation of companies from the industrial estate, energy companies and Teresa Ribera, Fourth Vice-President of the Government and Minister for Ecological Transition, to address the energy transition in the industrial sector.



Support for the implementation of the **first green hydrogen station in Spain**

Within the framework of our agreement with TMB, we support the implementation in the Zona Franca of the first green hydrogen service station for public use in Spain, managed by Iberdrola and located on a plot of land on calle D of the industrial estate.

PERTE, **Electric and Connected Vehicle**

We are part of the group of public entities, institutions and enterprises that make up the PERTE, or Project for the Recovery and Economic Transformation of the Electric and Connected Vehicle, an initiative of the Ministry of Industry, Trade and Tourism to create the necessary ecosystem in Spain for the development and production of electric and grid-connected vehicles that will convert the country into a European Hub for electromobility. **The PERTE plans to mobilise €24 billion, of which €4.3 billion will be provided by the public sector.** In addition, as many as 140,000 jobs could be created. The CZFB is putting its infrastructure at the service of the project, proposing two test circuits for use cases that could then be transferred to the market.



Commitment to **low-impact mobility:**

- Extension of the bike lane on the industrial estate, which is already more than 2 km long
- Installation of electric charging stations in the area around DFactory Barcelona
- Promotion of shared modes of transport



Circular economy actions

For years we have been promoting the circular economy to recover or reduce the waste produced by companies through business symbiosis. In recent months, **35 companies from 10 sectors** have participated in the resource recovery system, seeking ways to reuse jute sacks, industrial packing materials, organic waste, water and other elements derived from their daily activities. We presented this symbiosis strategy at the Catalunya Ecocircular HOTSPOT conference held in Barcelona in 2021.

Other activities:

- Environmental recovery of soil contaminated by hydrocarbons and organochlorines on several plots of land, an initiative in which **we invested over €450,000**
- Studies to examine expanding the **Ecoenergy network on the industrial estate** and reactivating the use of reclaimed water in the industrial area

Towards a greener, more humane and collaborative Zona Franca

We are working to make the Zona Franca a more sustainable, natural and pleasant area through:

● Planting of more than **300 trees**

● Improved maintenance of **trees and shrubs**

● New street **signage**

● Installation of **monolith markers and digital information screens** at the entrances to the industrial estate

● **Creation of landscaped rest areas** at five places on the industrial estate
